



South Park Senior Citizens Board of Directors

The Senior Center began in 1972 when the South Park Neighborhood Center building became a neighborhood building. The building had been a fire station prior to 1972 and continues to be a City of Seattle owned building. The building has been operated since 1972 by the South Park Area Redevelopment Committee in agreement with the City.

The South Park Senior Citizens was incorporated June 24, 1985 in the State of Washington. IRS Tax Exemption was granted March 1986.

The Senior Center operated from its beginning until January 1, 2015 with the South Park Area Redevelopment Committee as its fiscal sponsor. SPSC became independent on January 1, 2015.

The South Park Senior Citizens Board has 8 or more officers and directors. Terms are for two years. The Board is a working Board that oversees the Senior Center operations and is responsible for setting policies, acting with fiduciary responsibility, and acting in the interests of the organization. Board members are expected to: be passionate about the mission, demonstrate leadership and vision for a growing organization, be involved in strategic discussions, and attend the monthly board meetings.
