### Instant Digital Library Cards

Want to check out an e-book or use our online resources but don't have a Seattle Public Library card yet? No problem! You can sign up for a Library card without visiting a Library branch if you are 13 or older, live in Seattle, and have a mobile phone.

After we verify your eligibility, you will get instant access to e-books and audiobooks through OverDrive, and access to the rest of our online resources within a few days.
